*Writing Intensive Course

- 1 JUST 429 is a prerequisite for JUST 430 only
- 2 Program electives are JUST or LEST courses. Others may be included with approval of the Department Chair
- 3 Students must complete 7 out of 10 GER areas, and have at least 30 total GER credits
- 4 Baccalaureate degrees require successful completion of the prescribed curriculum, composed of 45 upper division credit hours, 24 of which must be taken within the major. Students may need to complete 3 additional upper division credit hours of general electives to meet this requirement.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY: Graduates of Associate of Arts – Criminal Justice program at Columbia-Greene Community College must possess a **minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale**. SUNY Canton **assures acceptance for Columbia-Greene Community College students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better**. Students are encouraged to apply during their last semester at Columbia-Greene Community College.

**Master Articulation Agreement Between
State University of New York (SUNY) Canton
and
Columbia-Greene Community College**

Effective date: April 1, 2015

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of graduates from **Columbia-Greene Community College** to SUNY Canton. The objectives, terms and conditions of this agreement are set forth as follows:

OBJECTIVES

1. To attract qualified students to Columbia-Greene Community College and SUNY Canton.
2. To facilitate upward educational and career mobility by increasing accessibility to baccalaureate education for qualified individuals.
3. To provide students with advisement in academic and career planning throughout their program of study.
4. To reduce unnecessary repetition of general education and curricular content by providing seamless articulation opportunities.
5. To facilitate communication and academic coordination between faculty, students, and administrators at each institution.

ELIGIBILITY/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Students must complete the admission process at SUNY Canton.
2. Students must meet the academic requirements listed in the "*Terms of Agreement*".

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Students who have completed an Associates program at **Columbia-Greene Community College** will be accepted into a baccalaureate program at **SUNY Canton**.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY: Graduates of **Columbia-Greene Community College** must possess a **minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale**. SUNY Canton assures acceptance for **Columbia-Greene Community College** students who have **a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better**.¹ Students are encouraged to apply during their last semester at Columbia-Greene Community College.

TRANSFER CREDIT: A grade of C or better must be earned for each transfer credit of courses applicable to the Bachelor's Degree. (See *Appendix A* for list of specific college level courses.)

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: SUNY Canton requires that **120 or more¹ credits** be completed in order to earn a Bachelor's Degree. To be eligible for graduation with a Bachelor's Degree, a minimum of **30** credits must be taken in residence at SUNY Canton. **15** credits must be taken in the major, or acceptable cognates as determined by the department at SUNY Canton. Students will be required to matriculate in accordance with the guidelines as specified in the policies of the academic catalog.

¹ Exceptions may apply. Program-specific requirements are stated on the individual program's current course equivalency chart on file.



2+2 Program Articulations: The following SUNY Canton programs accept a corresponding Associate's degree as the first two years of the baccalaureate program. Students will enter with junior status and take third and fourth year courses to complete the baccalaureate program. (See program descriptions.) Specific requirements apply. Students are encouraged to apply during their last semester at Columbia-Greene Community College.

Nursing (Online program)

- Students must be able to provide proof of US Citizenship, legal residence or valid work visa.
- Proof of licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN). This must be submitted to the SUNY Canton Nursing Curriculum Coordinator by October 1 (for fall semester enrollment) or March 1 (for spring semester enrollment). Students who do not submit proof of licensure by the above listed date will be moved to non-matriculated status and withdrawn from the program at the end of the semester. (Students may reapply to the program once they supply proof of Registered Nurse License.)

IMPLEMENTATION: Students transferring under this agreement into SUNY Canton will, whenever possible, be provided with a projected outline of their individual requirements for the Bachelor's Degree.

LOCATION: SUNY Canton reserves the right to use classroom space at alternative locations and to offer all, or part, of this degree program online.

FINANCIAL AID: A student accepted into SUNY Canton under this agreement is eligible to participate in all financial aid, grants, and scholarship programs customarily open to transfer students.

PROGRAM CHANGES: If either SUNY Canton or Columbia-Greene Community College makes changes to their respective program(s), those changes will be communicated to the other college for review of the respective course equivalency chart.


