- <sup>2</sup> Seven of ten SUNY General Education Requirement subject areas (including mathematics and basic communication) and 30 credits of SUNY General Education courses must be completed within the first two years of full-time study of the program. The list of subject areas is: 1) Mathematics; 2) Natural Science; 3) Social Science; 4) American History; 5) Western Civilization; 6) Other World Cultures; 7) Humanities; 8) Arts; 9) Foreign Language; 10) Basic Communication.
- $^{3}$  A business elective (U/L) is an elective from Business school upper division courses.
- <sup>4</sup> Minimum mathematics requirement is MATH 121 College Algebra or MATH 123 Pre-Calculus Algebra, or equivalent.
- <sup>5</sup> Physics or Chemistry Electives can be chosen from any course in PHYS or CHEM.

# Master Articulation Agreement Between <u>State University of New York (SUNY) Canton</u> and Rockland Community College

Effective date: November 1, 2014

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of graduates from **Rockland Community College** to SUNY Canton. The objectives, terms and conditions of this agreement are set forth as follows:

### **OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To attract qualified students to Rockland Community College and SUNY Canton.
- 2. To facilitate upward educational and career mobility by increasing accessibility to baccalaureate education for qualified individuals.
- 3. To provide students with advisement in academic and career planning throughout their program of study.
- 4. To reduce unnecessary repetition of general education and curricular content by providing seamless articulation opportunities.
- 5. To facilitate communication and academic coordination between faculty, students, and administrators at each institution.

## **ELIGIBILITY/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Students must complete the admission process at SUNY Canton.
- 2. Students must meet the academic requirements listed in the "Terms of Agreement".

#### TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Students who have completed an Associates program at <u>Herkimer County Community College</u> will be accepted into a baccalaureate program at <u>SUNY Canton</u>.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY: Graduates of Herkimer County Community College must possess a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. SUNY Canton assures acceptance for Herkimer County Community College students who have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better. Students are encouraged to apply during their last semester at Herkimer County Community College.

**TRANSFER CREDIT**: A grade of C or better must be earned for each transfer credit of courses applicable to the Bachelor's Degree. (See *Appendix A* for list of specific college level courses.)

**DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**: SUNY Canton requires that <u>120 or more¹ credits</u> be completed in order to earn a Bachelor's Degree. To be eligible for graduation with a Bachelor's Degree, a minimum of <u>30</u> credits must be taken in residence at SUNY Canton. <u>15</u> credits must be taken in the major, or acceptable cognates as determined by the department at SUNY Canton. Students will be required to matriculate in accordance with the guidelines as specified in the policies of the academic catalog.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Exceptions may apply. Program-specific requirements are stated on the individual program's current course equivalency chart on file.



<u>2+2 Program Articulations</u>: The following SUNY Canton programs accept a corresponding Associate's degree as the first two years of the baccalaureate program. Specific requirements apply. Students are encouraged to apply during their last semester at <u>Rockland Community College</u>.

### Nursing (Online program)

- Students must be able to provide proof of US Citizenship, legal residence or valid work visa.
- Proof of licensure as a <u>Registered Nurse (RN)</u>. This must be submitted to the SUNY Canton Nursing Curriculum Coordinator by October 1 (for fall semester enrollment) or March 1 (for spring semester enrollment). Students who do not submit proof of licensure by the above listed date will be moved to non-matriculated status and withdrawn from the program at the end of the semester. (Students may reapply to the program once they supply proof of Registered Nurse License.)

**IMPLEMENTATION:** Students transferring under this agreement into SUNY Canton will, whenever possible, be provided with a projected outline of their individual requirements for the Bachelor's Degree.

**LOCATION:** SUNY Canton reserves the right to use classroom space at alternative locations and to offer all, or part, of this degree program online.

**FINANCIAL AID:** A student accepted into SUNY Canton under this agreement is eligible to participate in all financial aid, grants, and scholarship programs customarily open to transfer students.

**PROGRAM CHANGES**: If either SUNY Canton or <u>Rockland Community College</u> makes changes to their respective program(s), those changes will be communicated to the other college for review of the respective course equivalency chart.
