THE AGREEMENT

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of graduates SUNY Canton's Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.), Nursing program to SUNY Plattsburgh's Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Nursing program.

OBJECTIVES

1. To attract qualified students to SUNY Canton and SUNY Plattsburgh.
2. To facilitate upward educational career mobility in nursing.
3. To promote the efficient transfer of qualified students from SUNY Canton to SUNY Plattsburgh.
4. To disseminate program specific information to students who wish to obtain a baccalaureate degree in nursing.
5. To provide students with advisement in academic and career planning throughout their program of study.
6. To reduce the completion of unnecessary courses.
7. To facilitate communication and academic coordination between faculty, students and administrators at each institution.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. A graduate of SUNY Canton's Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.), Nursing program, may be accepted into SUNY Plattsburgh's Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Nursing program, upon meeting the following conditions:
 - a. Apply for admission to SUNY Plattsburgh.
 - b. Achieve a minimum over-all cumulative grade point average of 2.5.
2. SUNY Plattsburgh will accept all 21 SUNY Canton non-nursing courses.
3. A maximum of 34 nursing credits will be awarded to SUNY Canton AAS Nursing graduates in recognition of basic nursing preparation, as validated by successful performance on the NCLEX-RN and successful completion of NUR350.
4. A Bachelor of Science with the major in Nursing will be awarded upon meeting the following:
 - a. Satisfactory completion of a minimum of 120 credit hours.
 - b. A minimum grade point average of 2.0.
 - c. A minimum grade of "C" in Written Expression (SUNY Canton's ENGL101).

- d. A minimum grade of "C" must be earned in all departmental nursing and cognate (required non-nursing) courses.
 - e. A minimum of 42 credit of upper-division, 300-400 level courses, with 21 of the upper-division credits being completed in residence at Plattsburgh.
 - f. Requirements of the Progression Policy of the nursing program must be met.
 - g. The undergraduate residency requirement of SUNY Plattsburgh must be met, but the senior residency requirement does not apply.
 - h. NUR350 must be taken prior to senior (400-level) nursing courses.
 - i. The Plattsburgh portion of this program must be completed within six years of beginning the first nursing course.
 - j. The residency requirement is 36 credit hours completed at Plattsburgh.
 - k. Completion of 60 credits in liberal arts.
 - l. Completion of general education.
 - m. Completion of all major requirements.
5. SUNY Canton and SUNY Plattsburgh will disseminate information about this articulation agreement.
 6. Changes in this agreement can be made at any time by mutual consent.
 7. This agreement will remain in effect for three years. The agreement can be terminated by either party prior to this date. Termination would require a minimum of six months notification.
