

Appendix A

Articulation Agreement Between <u>State University of New York (SUNY) Canton</u> and <u>Delaware-Chenango-Madison-Otsego (DCMO) BOCES</u>

Effective dates: February 1, 2019 through January 31, 2024

The following document indicates how the courses taken at BOCES transfer into the programs noted. All transfer courses receive a grade of *TR* and are not used in computing the student's grade point average.

Students receiving a course grade of "B" (80%) or higher in the following BOCES course may be eligible to receive transfer credit through SUNY-Canton.

<u>NOTE</u>: Students must submit a copy of their official BOCES or high school transcript to SUNY Canton in order to receive credit for their BOCES coursework. Transcripts should be sent to: *SUNY Canton, Admissions Office, 34 Cornell Drive, Canton, NY 13617.*

In addition to eligibility and admission requirements, students must also meet the following requirements in order to receive credit for the above listed courses:

- Present evidence of a valid 2-year CTE certificate of completion in Early Child Hood Education
- Possess final average in CTE Early Childhood Education program of 80% or higher, documented by an official BOCES transcript
- Receive a minimum grade of B (80%) in ECHD 101 (Introduction to Early Childhood) at SUNY Canton
- Present a CTE portfolio with course information, completed assignments, evidence of content learned the semester prior to ECHD 121 (Second semester, first year of ECHD)
- Present CTE senior project prior to ECHD 200
- Provide letter of support/recommendation from CTE Early Childhood Instructor
- Make a formal written request for this waiver, to the ECHD Program Director, and provide all supporting documents listed above prior to pre-scheduling for the second-semester at SUNY Canton.

Master Articulation Agreement Between <u>State University of New York (SUNY) Canton</u> and

DCMO (Delaware-Chenango-Madison-Otsego) BOCES

Effective date: March 1, 2018

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of graduates of programs at the **DCMO BOCES** to applicable programs at SUNY Canton. The objectives, terms and conditions of this agreement are set forth as follows:

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To attract qualified students to SUNY Canton who will enter with advanced standing.
- 2. To facilitate upward educational and career mobility in the indicated programs by increasing accessibility to a post-secondary education for qualified individuals.
- 3. To provide students with advisement in academic and career planning throughout their program of study.
- 3. To reduce unnecessary repetition of curricular content by providing a seamless articulation opportunity.
- 4. To facilitate communication, academic coordination between faculty, students, and administrators at each institution.

ELIGIBILITY / ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Students who have a minimum grade, as noted in Appendix A in the courses indicated, will receive the indicated transfer credit at SUNY Canton.
- 2. Students must complete the admission process at SUNY Canton.
- 3. Students must meet the academic requirements listed in the "Terms of Agreement".
- 4. Students are encouraged to apply early, usually no later than the second semester of their senior year.
- Students receiving transfer credit under this agreement will, whenever possible, be provided with a projected outline of their remaining requirements to complete their program of choice at SUNY Canton.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

TRANSFER CREDIT: Upon acceptance and enrollment at SUNY Canton, DCMO BOCES students receiving a course grade of 85%¹ or higher in the BOCES course(s) will be eligible to receive transfer credit through SUNY Canton's program(s).

Students must submit a copy of their official BOCES transcript to SUNY Canton in order to receive credit for their BOCES coursework. Only those courses outlined on the following chart will be accepted for transfer. The chart indicates exactly how the courses transfer to the SUNY Canton program. All transfer courses receive a grade of *TR* and are not used in computing the student's grade point average.

¹ Exceptions may apply. Program-specific requirements are stated on the individual program's appendix on file.



<u>FINANCIAL AID</u>: Students accepted under this agreement are eligible to participate in all financial aid, grants, and scholarship programs customarily open to transfer students.

<u>COURSE/PROGRAM CHANGES</u>: If either SUNY Canton or DCMO BOCES make changes to their respective course(s)/program(s), those changes will be communicated to the other college for review of this articulation agreement.
