This course explores the processes of policy making and law that address many of the key health concerns that face the U.S. Students will learn to think critically about potential causative factors associated with these health issues and the policy alternatives that are needed to address them effectively. The impacts of individual rights, federal and state regulations as well as health economics are considered. Students apply their course learning in the development of a final policy analysis brief that addresses a health policy issue of their choice. Resulting policy analysis competence skills can be applied in any health practice setting.
