This course is designed to provide for the transition from the student role to the graduate role. Review of national exam material on a weekly basis throughout the semester will help to prepare students for the licensing exam. A final advocacy project and reflective paper provide an opportunity for students to demonstrate their growth and preparation to effectively fulfill their role as an inclusive healthcare provider.
