JUST 406:

Recommendations:	Require mandatory attendance to lectures for this course. This was the first time that it was offered with an online portion. The two groups that did not reach 80% were both online groups.
Reflections/Notes:	This was during the COVID pandemic and students and faculty alike were still learning delivery methods as well as dealing with the state of the world.

JUST 201 - ISLO 4

Overall: benchmarks for achieving learning content for each SLO should be increased above 60% in future semesters.

For each weekly writing assessment, students most commonly experience issues with reading comprehension and completing all portions of the written responses. Possibly break the questions up into smaller, individualized writing responses instead of larger responses with multiple components.

For global learning content: Possibly re-arrange learning content in future semesters so that either: 1) there is a stand-alone lesson, or week of lessons, on global impact of critical issues; or 2) alter the weekly writing assessments so that students are identifying and describing global impact regularly.

JUST 201 – ISLO 4

Recommendations:	For Social Responsibility ISLO, students need more reinforcement of application of concepts.

Reflections/Notes:	This year I evaluated Social Responsibility with a paper
	submission instead of through their presentation projects.
	This produced better, more thoughtful work on social
	responsibility. I also re-wrote the final essay prompt to

	intentionally drive students toward this learning objective, which was not always achieved through their presentation projects in previous semesters.

Reflections/Notes:	More one-on-one sessions were conducted with students compared to in-person sections.
JUST 310 – Communication:	
Recommendations:	I offered Final Exam review, in which I spent considerable time explaining expectations for the exam essays. Students who did not attend the review were more likely to be the students who submitted paragraphs, sentences, or did not correctly interpret the question. Possibly provide some "review" announcements/emails for the students who choose not to attend Exam Review sessions.
