
APA CITATION, 7th EDITION: QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

References: The reference list is placed at the end of the essay and provides a list of all sources used. Entries are arranged alphabetically and double-spaced using a hanging indent. Please note we've single-spaced here to conserve space.

In-text (parenthetical) citations: In-text citations are placed in parentheses at the end of the quotation, clause, or sentence in which you mention the source material. They provide just enough info for the reader to easily locate the corresponding reference list entry and typically include the author's last name and the year of publication. Include page numbers, if available, for quoted material. Place any final punctuation after the parenthetical citation.
